

2. SAND AND STAIN

Grab a sheet of sandpaper

frame. Apply your stain and polyurethane finish to the wood and let it dry.

Next, grab your remaining four 12" 2x2s, pre-drill, apply

bottom and screw them into the frame. 4. GLUING IN PAVERS Place a thick bead of adhesive along the inside

Gently place each paver into place and avoid getting the adhesive on the front of the pavers or on the outer

Finally, take your bungee cords and wrap them around the planter while the adhesive is drying. Let the adhesive set overnight to get a strong bond.


