



## Project: DIY Dipped-Effect Outdoor Bench

### Paint an outdoor bench to spruce up your front porch

I really wanted to bring our front space to life and add in a variety of colors, which we've never done before. Painting our outdoor bench was an easy way to bring in color, and I love how it stands out on our porch!



### Supply List:

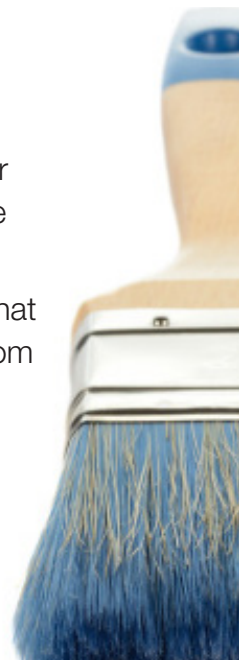
- ScotchBlue™ Painter's Tape
- Bench
- Spray primer
- Spray paint (two colors of your choice)
- Tinfoil



### Step 1

First, clean the bench and let it fully dry. Add your first coat of primer to help the paint adhere to the surface.

I propped the bench up on quart paint cans so that I could paint the legs easily. Spray paint the bottom of the bench with the color that you want to be "dipped." Use at least two coats to ensure full coverage.

### Step 2

Next, use tinfoil to cover the entirety of the bench's lower legs. Then use ScotchBlue™ Painter's Tape to cover the support bars and upper part of the legs.



### Step 3

Spray the remainder of the bench with your second color. Let dry 30 minutes in between coats. Finally, remove the foil and painter's tape and admire your new dipped-effect outdoor bench!

Pair your bench with a patterned cushion to really brighten up your front porch!
