

Vintage Bike Restoration

Bring new life to the old bicycle sitting in your garage with a few coats of spray paint

VINTAGE BIKE RESTORATION

Childhood memories and classic style can be restored with the help of Rust-Oleum Stops Rust Spray Paint. Protect your bike from future rust with bold color and superior durability in a few easy steps.

ITEMS:

- Rust-Oleum Stops Rust Gloss Protective Enamel Spray Paint in Tuscan Sun
- Old bike
- Drop cloth
- Wire brush
- Bucket with soap & water
- Sponge or cleaning cloth
- Towel
- Painter's tape
- Disposable Nitrile gloves

STEPS:

Step 1: Always work in a well-ventilated area and use a drop cloth to protect from overspray.

Step 2: Remove any loose paint or rust spots from the metal surface of your bike with a wire brush.

Step 3: Clean the bike with soap and water and dry thoroughly with a towel. Allow the entire bike to dry completely before painting.

Step 4: Use painter's tape to cover any areas of the bike you don't want to paint.

Step 5: Shake the can of Rust-Oleum Stops Rust Gloss Tuscan Sun for 1 minute after the ball begins to rattle to mix the paint evenly.

Step 6: Apply 2-3 light coats of paint onto the bike holding the can approximately 10" from the surface with a few minutes between each coat. For best results, apply additional coats within 1 hour or after 48 hours.

Step 7: Allow your bike to dry for about 48 hours after the final coat before handling the freshly restored ride.

Tip: Apply a few light coats of Rust-Oleum Stops Rust Metal Primer or Rusty Metal primer (for heavily rusted surfaces) before spray painting to maximize rust protection on your outdoor metal project.
